Now in its 14th year, our popular Primary Schools Book Award and reading challenge will run during Spring Term 2021.

From the hundreds of brilliant books published during 2020, we have arrived at a shortlist of 11. It is up to pupils to vote for their favourite to win. The award is aimed at years 5 & 6.

Our aim is to create enthusiasm and excitement about reading and to support the wider reading agenda in school. The book list has been carefully selected to cater for a range of abilities and interests that will appeal to both boys and girls in years 5 & 6.

It's free for all LEA schools and subscribing academies. There is a small admin charge for non-subscribing academies.

How will it work?

Each child will be given a passport with a different sticker to collect every time they finish a book.

Schools will need to purchase set(s) of the shortlisted titles. Hills Books are offering a 30% discount with free plastic jackets if you order through us. Cost per set is £55.

Books, passports and stickers will be delivered in early January. Pupils can then start to read as many books from the shortlist as possible.






Mystery/Adventure



Tsang, Katie & Kevin **Dragon Mountain** *Dark Blue*




Spangler, Jenni **Vanishing Trick** *Dark Red*
